ARTIST SHOWCASE DAILY 10 AM-5 PM

S. Brian Berkun (Discipline: Photography)

New to the festival, Berkun uses tone-mapped digitally enhanced photography and software to create photographs that resemble palette knife paintings or etchings. All works are printed on canvas or metal.



Jessica Joy (Discipline: Painting)

New to the festival, Joy creates colorful original ink paintings on synthetic paper. She uses various techniques and tools to move the ink around the surface – from brushes and air flow to heat guns and more.



Eileen Goldenberg (Discipline: Clay and Ceramics)

Goldenberg's hand-thrown porcelain features original designs and custom glazes formulated by the artist. New to the festival, Goldenberg offers an array of large plates, teapots, salad bowls, watercolor bowls and more.



Michael Panetta (Discipline: Glass)

This popular glass artist, new to the Festival, creates colorful hand-blown glass creations that use a mirroring process to produce a reflective quality. After apprenticing under various U.S. mentors, Panetta studied under world-renowned glass artist Pino Signoretto in Murano, Italy.

Aasia Hamid (Discipline: Jewelry)

New to the festival, Hamid is a beadwork master who creates wearable works of art that feature intricate designs, rich colors and texture with natural stones, Swarovski crystals and seed beads.



Bobby Wheat (Discipline: Photography)

Bobby's large-scale photographic works abound with complex narratives told through minimal and meditative imagery, creating scenes from nature that are so stunning, they border on surreal.



ARTIST DEMONSTRATIONS



Mel Mendez, a new artist to the festival from Arizona, will conduct weaving demonstrations on his foot-pedal loom using brightly colored 100 percent wool yarn. This model loom dates back to the Zapotec civilization that is more than 2,500 years old.

Barbara Gomes, Suann Lester and Jo Anne Pelletiere, all from Las Vegas and members of the Nevada Clay Guild, will provide hand-building pottery demonstrations at 11:00 AM and 2:00 PM on Saturday and Sunday.

Darren Kensington, a Las Vegas jeweler with Lyght Jewelry and Fine Art, will fabricate and forge silver and gold bracelets, rings and other jewelry items at his jeweler's bench throughout the Festival.

Guerrilla Artz Foundation is a Southern Nevada nonprofit that provides emerging and established artists the opportunity to paint and display their work in public. At the Festival, Guerrilla Artz Exhibition Artists will paint in multiple locations with opportunities for adults and children to create their own paintings on Guerrilla Coloring Books.

Pandr Design, a San Diego-based boutique design studio, is painting fun, catchy slogans and phrases on tote bags for only \$5! All proceeds benefit Project Imagine, a nonprofit Arts in Medicine program that brings artists and musicians to the bedside of children who are hospitalized to help them deal with pain, anxiety and feelings of isolation through creative expression.
